Ripples on the Shore

12" Square Aran/worsted yarn and 5.5mm hook. Approx. 140m/152yds.

10" square Double knitting yarn and 4mm hook. Approx. 120 m/129 yds.



Watching gentle waves lapping on the shore, at the edge of the ocean, a time for quiet contemplation, to allow space and time to just breathe.

UK Terms used throughout.

Abbreviations

St, sts	Stitch, stitches	Dc	Double crochet
R	Round	Htc	Half treble crochet
Ch	Chain	Tr	Treble crochet
Sl-st	Slip stitch	Dtr	Double treble crochet

[] Hints: Are typed in italics and coloured purple, they are to help and guide you and hopefully make life a little easier, especially for beginners.

Reference to photos is [P] with the relevant photo number

- * * Repeat instructions between asterisks the amount of times specified. This is normally a repeat for a complete side and will consist of multiple instructions.
- () Repeat instructions between parentheses the amount of times specified. This is a lower level repeat.

Special Stitches

Popcorn: Make 5 tr in same st, remove hook from loop and insert from front to back of 1st tr and then into dropped loop and pull through. Ch 1 to close. This closing chain is not counted in any chains you are asked to make after the popcorn. To make a **beginning popcorn**, simply start with a standing tr or ch 3 as your 1st st.

1. Starting with a magic ring, ch 1 and make 16 dc into ring. Join to 1st dc with a sl-st. Stitch count: 16 dc.



2. Ch 3 [*counts as tr*] and make a beginning popcorn, [P1] (ch 3, skip next st, popcorn in next st) 7 times, ch 3. [P2] Join to beginning popcorn, fasten off, *but do not work away until after R3*. Stitch count: 8 popcorns, 8 ch-3 spaces.




3. Join with a standing dc in any popcorn, [P1]

(working behind ch-3 space 2 dtr in skipped st R1, dc in next popcorn) [P2] 8 times, omit last dc. Join to standing dc with a sl-st.

Stitch count: 8 dc, 16 dtr.




4. Ch 3 [*counts as tr*], (tr, ch 2, 2 tr) in same st, [P1] *tr in next 5 sts, in next st (2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr). *[P2] Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last corner group. Join to top of ch-3, fasten off, and secure ends. Stitch count: per side: 9 tr, 1 ch-2 corner space.



5. Join with a standing tr in last st of any side, [P1] *ch 8, skip ch-2 corner space, (tr in next st, ch 3, skip next st) 4 times, tr in next st. *[P2] Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last tr.

Join to standing tr, fasten off, *but do not work away until after* R7. Stitch count: per side: 5 tr, 4 ch-3 loops, 1 ch-8 corner loop.




6. Join with a standing dc in last tr of any side, [P1]

*working behind ch-8 corner loop, 5 dtr in ch 2 space R4 [place marker in 3rd dtr],


(dc in next st, working behind ch-3 loop, dtr in skipped st R4) 4 times, dc in next st.* [P2] Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last dc.

Join to standing dc with a sl-st.

Stitch count: 5 dc, 8 dtr, 1 corner dtr.




7. Ch 3 [*counts as tr*], tr in next 2 sts, [P1]
*working over ch-8 loop, in corner dtr (2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr), tr in next 13 sts. *[P2]
Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last 3 tr.
Join to top of ch-3, fasten off, and secure ends.
Stitch count: per side: 17 tr, 1 ch-2 corner space.



8. Join with a standing tr in last st of any side, [P1]

*ch 8, skip ch-2 corner space, (tr in next st, ch 3, skip next st) 8 times, tr in next st. *[P2] Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last tr.

Join to standing tr, fasten off, *but do not work away until after R10*. Stitch count: per side: 9 tr, 8 ch-3 loops, 1 ch-8 corner loop.



9. Join with a standing dc in last tr of any side, [P1]

*working behind ch-8 corner loop, 5 dtr in ch 2 space R7 [place marker in 3rd dtr],

(dc in next st, working behind ch-3 loop, dtr in skipped st R7) 8 times, dc in next st.* [P2] Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last dc.

Join to standing dc with a sl-st.

Stitch count: 9 dc, 12 dtr, 1 corner dtr.



10. Ch 3 [*counts as tr*], tr in next 2 sts, [P1] *working over ch-8 loop, in corner dtr (2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr), tr in next 21 sts. *[P2] Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last 3 tr. Join to top of ch-3 with a sl-st. Stitch count: per side: 25 tr, 1 ch-2 corner space.



11. Ch 1 and dc in same st, htr in next st, tr in next 2 sts, dtr in next st, [P1]

*5 dtr in ch-2 corner space [*place marker in 3rd dtr*], [*take care not to skip the 1st hidden st*] (dtr in next st, tr in next 2 sts, htr in next st, dc in next st, htr in next st, tr in next 2 sts) 3 times, dtr in next st. *[P2]

Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last 5 sts.

Join to 1st dc, fasten off, and secure ends.

Stitch count: per side: 3 dc, 6 htr, 12 tr, 8 dtr, 1 corner dtr.



12. Join with a standing htr in last st of any side, [P1]
*3 htr in corner dtr [*place marker in 2nd htr*], htr in next 29 sts. *[P2]
Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last htr.
Join to standing htr, fasten off, and secure ends.
Stitch count: per side: 31 htr, 1 corner htr.



13. Join with a standing dc in last st of any side, [P1]
*in corner htr (dc, ch 2, dc), dc in next 4 sts,
(htr in next 2 sts, tr in next st, dtr in next st, tr in next st, htr in next 2 sts, dc in next st)
3 times, dc in next 3 sts. *[P2]
Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last dc.
Join to standing dc with a sl-st.
Stitch count: per side: 12 dc, 12 htr, 6 tr, 3 dtr, 1 ch-2 corner space.



14. Ch 3 [*counts as tr*], tr in next st, [P1]
*in ch-2 corner space (2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr), skip next [*hidden*] st, tr in next 32 sts. *[P2]
Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last 2 tr.
Join to top of ch-3 with a sl-st.
Stitch count: per side: 36 tr, 1 ch-2 corner space.



15. Ch 3 [*counts as tr*], tr in next 3 sts, [P1]

*in ch-2 corner space (2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr), tr in next 36 sts [*take care not to skip the 1st hidden st*].* Repeat from * to * 4 times, omit last 4 tr.

Join to top of ch-3, fasten off, and secure ends.

Stitch count: per side: 40 tr, 1 ch-2 corner space.



Lightly block your finished square for a perfect finish, and to make joining easier.
